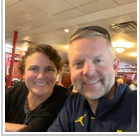

“ I had the pleasure of first meeting Alleen when she came into the CMS gym one day in 2007. I was the 7th grade coach at the time and she offered to help out where she could as she wanted to get back in to volleyball again, the sport she loved. She just wanted to help, wanted to teach, wanted to build and was willing to start where all good programs should--at the youngest level. That fall she kindly and in a helpful, unassuming manner, began building the program she would eventually lead.

The next fall, I moved up to become the 8th grade coach and Alleen stepped in as the 7th grade coach. It was those next three years, when I worked closely with Alleen, that her values about life, sports, teamwork and dedication really impacted me. I saw her instill a work ethic in our players and a never-give-up attitude that permeated the program at CMS. She pushed me and our players to not accept winning as a primary goal, but skill development, commitment to the program and pushing players out of their comfort zones to challenge themselves. She helped me navigate issues with middle school girls, with parents and with my own bumps in the road. She was my mentor and she helped me grow as a coach and a person.

That mantra of growth couldn't be clearer than in the spring of her first varsity season in 2011 when we started the 6th grade volleyball program. We grabbed 3 weeks of gym time in the spring and introduced the sport, gave out prizes and made it fun. We played area schools on Saturdays in a non-competitive, learning environment. She brought in her Varsity and JV players to help coach the girls as they stumbled through learning a sport that takes a lot of patience and time to learn to play well. This helped, not only our younger players, but taught our ERHS girls the values of patience and gave them a chance to reflect on their own skills as they taught younger girls. A couple of years later, we brought 5th graders into the mix and continued to see improvement in our program.

This past March 2016, our last season with the 5th and 6th graders

(45 girls!), Alleen wanted to push our program further. After a successful season the year prior having a graduated senior, Molly Gregorski, help coach the 5th graders, she wanted to bring in other ERHS players to help coach on "game days" with the girls. The younger girls looked up to the ERHS players, like sophomore Allison Ashurst, called them "coach" and talked of days when, one day, they would play on the Varsity team. And, as Alleen looked to the future she talked about plans to push the program into the 3rd and 4th grades next year. Her dedication to ER volleyball and its growth had no boundaries. She was always learning, always looking ahead to the next challenge and was always so positive about what was to come for our program.

The future of Elk Rapids volleyball is bright... very bright. And that fire that ignited who we are today and who we will become was Coach Popp. She talked of such excitement for this summer and next fall as we bring a new talented and dedicated freshman class poised to help take us to the next level. Players in our program continue to show a drive, a vision, a hunger that I haven't seen for some time here in Elk Rapids, and I credit that to Alleen's leadership, her positive outlook on people and life and her unending love for volleyball. I am blessed to have know Coach Popp for a decade and hope that we, as a program, can take the skills, the commitment and the love she gave to Elk Rapids volleyball and keep building toward the ultimate goals she new we could achieve.

To honor her legacy, we have created the Alleen Popp ER Scholarship Fund to help young Elk Rapids players pay for clinics, camps and fees that help them became better volleyball athletes, leaders and young women. She was always looking out for her players and our ER program and this fund will honor those loves.

Goodbye, my friend, my mentor, my Coach.
