February 6, 1934 - March 10, 2015

Ford El Nathan Myers, 81, of Coldsprings Township, passed away March 10, 2015 at Munson Medical Center. Mr. Myers was born on February 6, 1934 in LaGrange, Indiana to the late Carl and Sylvia (Gannon) Myers. Ford entered the U.S. Army in 1953 and was stationed in Baumholder, Germany; where he served as a tank commander for the 2nd Armored Division whose motto was "Hell on Wheels". After being discharged in 1955; Ford began as a woodworker. He later worked as a salesman for Fuller Brush, and eventually became a salesman and service manager for Volkswagon-Porsche-Audi. In his spare time he still loved woodworking and crafts, as well as being outdoors: hiking, camping, horseback riding, and motorcycle riding. He was a member of the Boy Scouts and Freedom Cruisers Riding Club. Ford is survived by his wife Janet (Lieber) Myers; daughter Theresa and son in law Donald Hoggard; sons Michael and Christopher Myers; step daughter Katherine Lieber; grandchildren Maria Burel and Danielle Cilluffo; great grandchildren Maria "Mia" Burel and Jacob Burel; sister Jean Durkin; and brothers Harold and Garold Myers. He was preceded in death by his parents and his first wife Maria (Eisgruber) Myers.
