Margaret Doris Quist, 93, of Williamsburg, passed away on May 26, 2012 at Munson Medical Center. Mrs. Quist was born June 30, 1918 in Toronto, Ontario, Canada to the late Kathleen (Culliton) and Joseph Farquharson. She grew up in Detroit, the oldest of six children. Doris worked her way through Marygrove College, met her future husband on a blind date, and on June 3, 1944 married Claude Quist. They moved to Chicago while Claude completed school at Northern Illinois College of Optometry. They moved to Sault Ste. Marie in 1950 where Claude began his practice. They raised two daughters while Doris continued her education and earned a Master's Degree and teaching certificate. She taught at Sault High School until retirement. She was an active member of Alpha Delta Kappa Sorority, the American Association of University Women, and the Elks Club. After retirement, Doris spent many hours volunteering at the Alma Hospital and St. Mary's Elementary school as a teacher's aide and classroom Grandma. After moving to Williamsburg in 2003 to live with Karen, Scott and Kate, she continued by knitting hats for the hospital nursery. Doris enjoyed playing golf and bridge, reading, knitting and solving crossword puzzles. She loved to travel, especially to her family heritage home of Scotland. Doris was preceded in death by her husband Claude and one brother.
