Paul Blythe Craig, 81, of Traverse City, passed away at Munson Medical on December 4, 2014. Paul was born to Paul and Hazel (Roney) Craig on November 27, 1933. Paul was born in Linden, Michigan and lived in Flint for 42 years. He then moved to Elkhart, Indiana for 2 years, then on to San Diego, California and Phoenix, Arizona for 10 years each. 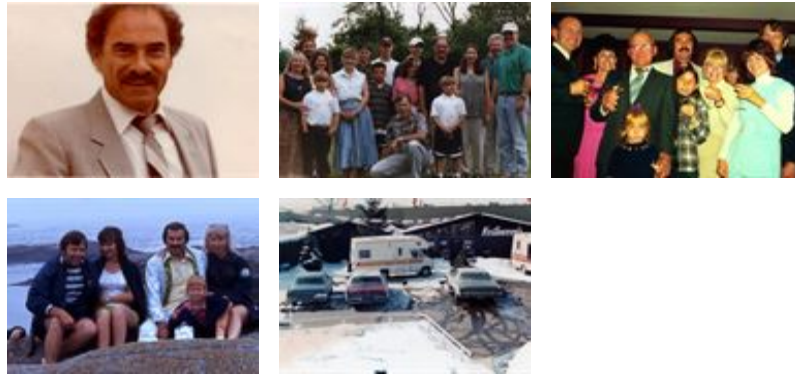
